

Legislative Update

The smokefree air bill, HB1018, that exempts casinos, bars, fraternal clubs and allows for smoking rooms in nursing homes, passed out of the House of Representatives on January 31 with a bi-partisan vote of 68-31 and moves to the Senate. The bill has been assigned to the Public Policy Committee which is chaired by Senator Ron Alting (R-Lafayette). Senator Alting is a co-sponsor of the smokefree air bill. Additional sponsors include: Senator Bev Gard (R-Greenfield), Senator Greg Taylor (D-Indianapolis), and Senator Vi Simpson (D-Ellettsville).

While the bill contains some exemptions that we do not agree with, we are pleased the bill continues moving forward so it can be strengthened in the

Senate. The Indiana Campaign for Smoke-free Air will work diligently with legislators to take advantage of every opportunity to strengthen the bill as it moves through the process.
